



## FPI corporate indicators

Corporate indicators are indicators that monitor FPI achievements as an EC Service. They monitor the implementation of the FPI Strategic Plan 2020-2024 and illustrate how FPI contributes to Objective 4 of the von der Leyen Commission's political priorities 'A Stronger Europe in the World' as described in the FPI Intervention Logic. The indicators chosen do not encompass all of FPI's activities but only highlight certain elements of a wider performance picture. They may also be used to monitor interventions.

### FPI RF Overall Objective 1: the EU position as peace maker on the international scene is further consolidated<sup>1</sup> – Impact indicators

Indicator: Global Peace Index – Positive Peace score<sup>2</sup>

Data source: Institute for Economics and Peace

Update: once a year

### FPI RF Overall Objective 2: the EU position as global standard setter and number one partner in support of the rules-based multilateral global order is further consolidated<sup>3</sup> – Impact indicators

Indicator: Number of processes related to partner country practices on trade, investment and businesses, or promoting the external dimension of EU internal processes or EU interests, which have been influenced.

Update: once a year

Indicator: Worldwide Governance Indicator (voice & accountability)

Data source: The World Bank

Update: every 5 years (next available data release in 2022)

### FPI RF Outcome indicators

FPI RF Outcome indicators monitor the extent to which FPI has reached its Specific Objectives as stated in the Strategic Plan 2020-2024. Data will be available annually from relevant Units/OPSYs.

NDICI Thematic Programme – Peace, Stability and Conflict Prevention (Peace-Building)

- Number of state institutions and non-state actors supported by the EU on security, border management, countering violent extremism, conflict prevention, protection of civilian population and human rights<sup>4</sup>

- Percentage calculation of pillar assessment compliance of civilian CSDP Missions not requiring supervisory measures as for article 154.5 of the Financial Regulation.

NDICI – Foreign Policy Needs

- Percentage of actions (programmes/projects) that score 'High' or 'Medium' on the gender sensitivity index
- Number of approaches and/or practices beneficial to the achievement of EU interests, values and standards which have been taken up in third countries

- Number of regulations and standards relating to trade, investment and business in partner countries which have been aligned to EU/international standards
- Number of EU regional, inter-regional, bi-lateral and multi-lateral cooperation partnership strategies (incl. strategies to address challenges of global concern) which have been developed, adopted or implemented.

#### NDICI – Election Observation Missions

- Number of electoral processes and democratic cycles supported, observed and followed by means of Electoral Missions (fully-fledged Electoral Missions, Election Experts Missions, Election Follow-up Missions, complementary activities).

#### Anti-Torture Regulation

- Number countries having committed to taking effective measures, inter alia through legislation and effective enforcement, for the restriction of the trade in goods used for capital punishment.

#### FPI RF Output indicators

FPI RF output indicators monitor the output produced by the actions managed by FPI, based on objectives defined. Data will be available annually from relevant Units or from OPSYS.

- Number of knowledge-based products developed, funded by FPI (reports, surveys, analysis, implementation plans, etc.)
- Percentage of FPI actions that are gender-responsive and gender-targeted (G-marker<sup>5</sup>)
- Number of technical equipment provided (in value)
- Number of actions managed by FPI
- Number of countries in which FPI intervenes
- Number of people directly benefiting from EU-supported interventions that specifically aim to support civilian post-conflict peace-building and/or conflict prevention (Women/Men/Girls/Boys)<sup>6</sup>
